BUTIAMA SAFE HOUSE

We started with 227 girls, with reconciliation efforts, at the end of January, there were 56 girls remaining at the Butiama safe house.

HEALTH ISSUES

Health check-up conducted to girls who arrived in both safe houses, this conducted in collaboration with police gender desk and social welfare. All girls had health check. Health services were provided to all children whom found with health problems after check up to the hospital were treated. Counselling sessions conducted to all girls. Medication to sick girls was done too.

LEGAL ISSUES

(progress with any ongoing cases)

3 rape cases continue in Butiama while 1 case get end [The perpetrator was sentenced for 30 years], 9 Cases in Serengeti, all cases continue in Serengeti, Bunda and Butiama. One case was completed in Serengeti, where the father of Jane Mapinduzi was taken to prison for 30 years. 3 new FGM cases opened at court in the seasonal cutting of 2020/2021.

VILLAGE ISSUES

(Any incidents reported, rumors, upcoming cutting etc.)

The seasonal cutting started girls fled from FGM and rescued from community in Serengeti, Butiama and Tarime, the rescue was done in collaboration with Police gender desks in Serengeti and Butiama. All 12 clans perform the cutting.

RESCUE CAMP PROGRAMMES & RECONCILIATIONS

Different programmes were conducted during the seasonal cutting in Butiama safe house and Hope Mugumu Safe house, where total of 434 were involved in the reconciliation programme in Serengeti, Butiama, Butiama and Rorya Districts in Mara Region. The reconciliation work was done in collaboration with Police gender desk officers, Social welfare, Psychologist and Hope staff. The work was succeeded by 98% and only 2% total of 15 new girls remained to the safe houses.

FORMAL EDUCATION AND VTC.

Hope for Girls and Women in Tanzania has managed to send girls to continue with their primary, secondary, High school, Vocational classes and continue with reading and writing class. Total of 37 joined tailoring class and Entrepreneurship where 3 girls continue with Hotel management and Hospitality. Total of 31 girls joined and continue with their primary education, 35 girls continue with secondary education, 1 continue with High school.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING

A total of 37 girls received vocational and entrepreneurship skills at the Safe Houses.
